BIOGRAPHY

1919	Born 24 December, Rodez, France
1938-9	Moved to Paris to train as a drawing teacher and briefly attended the Ecole nationale superieure des beaux-arts, Paris
1940	Drafted into the military
1941	Demobilised from the war
1941-2	Enrolled at the Ecole des beaux-arts in Montpellier and meets Colette Llaurens, his future wife
1942	Met Sonia Delaunay during Occupation and became interested in abstract art Married Colette Llaurens
1946	Settled in Courbevoie, near Paris and finally devoted his time fully to painting
1947	Hired a space to hang his work at the <i>Salon des surindependents</i> , it is the first time his paintings are exhibited publicly for the first time, and attract a great amount of interest
1948	Relocated to Montparnasse and received the visit of James Johnson Sweeney in his studio, future Director of the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum in New York
1949	First solo exhibition, Galerie Lydia Conti, Paris Musee de Grenoble made acquisition of his work Designed the costumes and sets for Roger Vailland's ballet <i>Heloise et Abelard</i> . Work included in the group show <i>Painted in 1949</i> , at Betty Parsons Gallery
1951	Work presented in The Philips Collection, Washington, DC
1952-4	Work acquired by the Museum of Modern Art, and the Guggenheim Museum, New York
1954	First American one-man show, Kootz Gallery, New York
1955	Exhibition at Gimpel Fils Gallery, London
1954-8	Exhibited with Samuel Kootz, signed a contract
1957	First trip to the US, where he meets artists including Mark Rothko, Willem de Kooning and Robert Motherwell
1958	Built a house and a studio, to his own design, in Sete, France
1960	First retrospective exhibition, Museum Folkwang, Essen, Germany
1964	Won the Carnegie Prize, from the Carnegie Museum of Art, Pittsburgh

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1966	Retrospective at the Museum of Fine Arts, Houston Received the design for a glass mosaic window at the Suermondt-Ludwig-Museum, Aachen
1967	Retrospective at the Musee national d'art modern, Paris
1968	Retrospective at the Musee d'art contemporain de Montreal Retrospective at Musee du Quebec Received a ceramic mural for the Oliver Tyrone Corporation skyscraper in Pittsburgh
1975	Created the first of three bronze reliefs, based on his earlier etchings
1976	Received the Rembrandt Award, Amsterdam
1979	Is named Foreign Honorary Member for Art, by the American Academy of Arts and Letters, New York Exhibition of the first single-pigment (later called 'outrenoir' or 'beyond black) paintings at the Musee national d'art moderne, Centre Georges Pompidou, Paris
1986	Won the Grand Prix National for Painting, Paris
1987	French state gives a major commission for the design of 104 windows for the Romanesque abbey at Conques, France
1993	Retrospective exhibition at the National Museum of Modern and Contemporary Art, Seoul
1994	Retrospective exhibition at the China Fine Arts Palace, Beijing Retrospective exhibition at the Taipei Fine Arts Museum
2001	Exhibition at the Hermitage Museum, St Petersburg Exhibition at the Tretyakov Gallery, Moscow
2009	Major retrospective exhibition at the Centre Georges Pompidou, Paris
2014	Musee Soulages opens in Rodez, France
2015	Received the Legion of Honour
2019	Retrospective exhibition, <i>Pierre Soulages au Louvre</i> , in Paris, celebrated the artist's 100th birthday
